

2016 Writing Competition

The Competition

The Patent Quality Initiative, an education, information and advocacy effort with the goal of improving the understanding, use and reliability of patents in financial services and elsewhere, is hosting a writing competition for law students to research and write about issues related to patent quality.

Submitted entries must focus primarily on one or more aspects of patent quality.

Examples of potential topics include:

- THE IMPACT OF LEGISLATION;
- CHANGES TO THE PATENT EXAMINATION PROCESS FOR IMPROVING THE QUALITY OF ISSUED PATENTS;
- ANALYSIS OF PROPOSED METHODS OF MEASURING PATENT QUALITY;
- IMPORTANCE OF PATENT QUALITY FOR SUPPORTING INNOVATION AND TECHNOLOGICAL DEVELOPMENT.

Prizes



The first place winner will be awarded a cash prize of \$3,000 and one second place winner will be awarded a cash prize of \$1,500.



Both of the winning entries will be published on the **Patently-O Patent Law Journal** and on **patentqualityinitiative.com.**
